## RAYMOND WYNN • KANSAS CITY FIRE DEPT LAST CALL \* MARCH 27, 2021









June 21, 1958 - March 27, 2021

Lloyd M. Ruediger proudly served his country in the United States Army from October 1961 to September 1967 in the 92nd Artillery in Germany. As a civilian Lloyd worked as a truck driver for Kellwood Manufacturing most of his life.

Lloyd was a member of St. Paul's Church in Berger and a very dedicated member of the Berger Community Volunteer Fire Department, which would eventually become the New Haven-Berger Fire Protection District. Lloyd selflessly gave his life in the line of duty on June 26, 2023, having served his community for 59 years and badge #006.

Lloyd served within many ranks and in many capacities throughout his volunteer career, including chief, assistant chief, second assistant chief, captain, lieutenant, secretary, and treasurer. Lloyd's professional fire service accomplishments include Firefighter of the Year in 1999, 2004, and 2013; Officer of the Year in 2007 and 2017; lifesaving award in 2014 where 3 lives were saved from a house fire and a CPR save in 2014.

In the few moments Lloyd wasn't serving his community with the fire department, he enjoyed hunting, fishing, and spending time with his family.

Lloyd is survived by two sons, Greg and Rick, daughter Lisa, four grandchildren; and nine great-grandchildren.

#### TO THE FAMILIES:

While the following names are being honored as non-line of duty tonight, we want to **very clearly indicate** that some of these names are currently awaiting administrative determinations regarding their passing as a "Line of Dury Death" (LODD) at the State or Federal levels and may be recognized as an LODD at a future date.

If your loved one is one of those names being honored in this way tonight, but awaiting this protracted review process, we are not making a determination in this presentation or listing of their name. We are only recognizing their service to their community for now and await with you regarding the future.

If it is determined their service was in the Line of Duty, those Honors will then be presented to them and their family regardless of any timeline. There is no expiration date for Line of Duty service.

With regard to the selection of non-line of duty names for these October services, we honor the names presented to us using a 3-year sliding scale. This starts with the prior year of 2023 plus an additional two previous years previous of 2022 & 2021 in case we have missed someone. Names are being presented in alphabetical order including those prior to 2023.



**Donald R. Abramovitz** • April 26, 2023, served 47 years with the *Creve Coeur Fire Prot. Dist.* achieving the rank of Asst. Fire Chief before retiring in 2012. Don was a US Navy veteran and served in the Vietnam war. After his enlistment, Don started employment with McDonnell Aircraft. In 1989, Don was instrumental in creating the St. Louis Co. Hazmat Response Team. Don was an avid boater, water skier & loved tinkering on projects in his garage.




